Social Workers work with children, adolescents and their families in diverse fields of practice. Through their practices, social workers:

- Provide individual, family and group counselling
- Coordinate and provide comprehensive services for children and adolescents with emotional, physical, social, and/or behavioral challenges
- Promote and support child and adolescent mental health through education and service delivery
- Connect children, adolescents and their families to community supports and services
- Work with the community and other professionals to identify children and adolescents who are in need of protection and to implement appropriate interventions
- Work with community partners to address issues such as bullying, violence, abuse, trauma and addictions
- Promote and contribute to research to inform best practices in work with children, adolescents and families
- Inform program development and social policy change that is in the best interests of children, adolescents and their families
- Contribute to the development and delivery of international programs and services to meet the needs of children, adolescents and families
