

SOCIAL WORK PRACTICE IN ACUTE CARE

DID YOU KNOW? Social workers in acute care help individuals, their families, and caregivers by:

- Completing bio-psychosocial assessments and assisting with discharge planning to ensure that all patients have adequate supports
- Developing treatment interventions to address the financial, practical, physical, social, and emotional impacts of their illness
- Working as a member of the interdisciplinary team with patients and their families/caregivers to build on strengths, understand challenges, and develop plans to meet individual needs
- Providing resource and supportive counselling to patients and their families/caregivers as needed
- Referring and connecting patients to appropriate services and resources within the hospital and the community
- Promoting self-advocacy and intervening to help individuals navigate the healthcare system
