**DID YOU KNOW?** Social workers work with children and their families in diverse fields of practice. Through their practices, social workers:

- Provide individual, family and group counseling
- Coordinate and provide comprehensive services for children with emotional, physical, social, and/or behavioral challenges
- Promote and support children's mental health and development through education and service delivery
- Connect children and their families to community supports and services
- Work with the community and other professionals to identify children who are in need of protection and to implement appropriate interventions
- Work with community partners to address issues such as bullying
- Promote and contribute to research to inform best practices in work with children and families
- Inform program development and social policy change that is in the best interests of children and their families
- Contribute to the development and delivery of international programs and services to meet the needs of children and families
