DID YOU KNOW? Social workers are employed in the field of mental health and addictions:

- Providing individual and group counselling to address issues related to mental illness, trauma, addictions, eating disorders, self-esteem, anger and coping, and parenting
- Counselling couples and families to address relationship issues
- Advocating for services for individuals
- Linking individuals and families to resources in the community
- Providing case management services to people who have a mental illness and could benefit from support as they live independently in the community
- Educating individuals and families about mental illness and addictions
- Providing community crisis response services
- Providing disaster response services to communities
- Promoting positive mental health at the individual, community, provincial, national and international level
