DID YOU KNOW? Social workers work with individuals and families from diverse multicultural backgrounds and who are new to Canada including immigrants and refugees:

- Working with individuals, families, groups and communities of people with diverse backgrounds to identify their strengths, resources and challenges and to assist them in achieving their goals
- Supporting individuals and families through all the stages of the settlement process
- Connecting individuals with community resources and supports
- Developing interventions to address financial, practical, physical, social, emotional and spiritual impacts of settlement
- Providing counselling, therapy and education to help individuals and families deal with crisis and change
- Assisting with networking, program planning and personal skill development
- Educating the community to build supports and increase awareness of diverse cultures
- Promoting self-advocacy and helping individuals navigate various systems
- Advocating for appropriate access to resources and social policy change
