DID YOU KNOW? Social Workers are employed in Psychosocial Oncology, which is a specialty in cancer care.

Oncology Social Workers help individuals, their families and caregivers by:

- Supporting individuals and families through all stages of the cancer experience; from prevention, diagnosis, treatment, survivorship, palliation and bereavement
- Assessing for cancer related distress from a biopsychosocial and spiritual perspective
- Developing treatment interventions to address financial, practical, physical, social, emotional and spiritual impacts of cancer
- Providing education and supportive counselling and therapy
- Promoting self-advocacy and intervening to help individuals navigate the health care system
- Advocating for services and access to care that promotes and respects each individuals' values, beliefs and rights while preserving personal dignity
