DID YOU KNOW? Social Workers play a key role in Project Management by:

- Conducting environmental scans, needs assessments, feasibility studies and reports to inform program development
- Consulting, liaising and networking with key members of the community, municipalities, government and other stakeholder agencies
- Writing funding proposals and grant applications
- Preparing financial budgets and project timelines
- Developing programs to meet identified needs and coordinating all aspects of projects, including management of staff and volunteers
- Implementing policies to guide services and program delivery
- Building collaborative relationships with community partners
- Participating in committee work and consulting with interdisciplinary groups to enhance services
- Engaging in fundraising efforts to support program delivery
- Evaluating programs and analyzing the impact of services on clients, partners and agencies to guide current and future programming
- Advocating for resources, policies and programs to address gaps in
